



CMS Ireland is a Christian Mission agency that works in partnership with the Church to share the Gospel in word and deed. They work with several dioceses in the Episcopal Church of the Sudan to advance evangelism, leadership training, education, healthcare, and vocational training.

Projects include:

Bishop Allison Theological College CMS Ireland contributes to the college's operating budget and provides assistance toward the repatriation of the college from Uganda to Sudan.

Diocese of Kajokeji *Kajokeji Ecumenical Training Programme* offers training on community leadership and HIV/AIDS awareness, and provides professional development for educators, counselors and trainers.

Kajokeji AIDS Awareness Initiative sensitises the local community about the presence and control of HIV/AIDS and provides care for those living with AIDS.

CMS Ireland also funded the construction on the *Kajokeji Ecumenical Christian Training Centre*.

Diocese of Maridi CMS built the *Chaima Bible School* and *Diocesan Health Clinic*, refurbished the *Haddow and Amaki Primary Schools*, and supports women's programmes and leadership training initiatives.

Diocese of Yei The *Yei Vocational Training College* teaches carpentry and joinery, building and concrete technology, vehicle mechanics and driving, craft skills, furniture production, and microenterprise.

Health Line Sudan provides primary healthcare at a diocesan clinic. With help from Irish Aid, CMS constructed a Primary Health Care Centre to provide quality healthcare and train health professionals.

CMS Ireland supports the *Yei Laymen Training Centre* for theological studies.

CMS Ireland also has connections with the Church in Yambio, Ibba, Ezo, and Rumbek.
